- Lack of variety of worship services (e.g. styles, special themed services)
- Lack of evangelism
- Lack of integration and involvement of all cultures in serving (Spanish congregants)

- Intentionally focussed growth and discipline/surrender
- Intentional witnessing/evangelism
- Applying Scripture to everyday life
- Deeper knowledge of Bible
